## Notice to Consider Adoption of Changes to California State Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program Guidelines

As part of the May 27, 2010, Business Meeting, the Energy Commission will consider adopting changes to the *California State Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program Guidelines* (*Guidelines*). These *Guidelines* were developed to help implement and administer rebates for qualifying appliances under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) has allocated to the Energy Commission \$35.2 million in ARRA funds to implement a State Energy Efficiency Appliance Rebate Program for California that will provide rebates to encourage the replacement of inefficient residential appliances with new energy efficient residential appliances. The *Guidelines* establish the eligibility and procedural requirements to qualify for rebates for the purchase of eligible residential appliances.

The *Guidelines* were originally adopted by the Energy Commission on December 16, 2009, and were subsequently amended on March 24, 2010 and additional changes proposed on April 22, 2010 that will be considered May 19, 2010.

At the direction of the Energy Commission's Ad Hoc Committee on Federal Stimulus Programs (Committee), proposed changes have been made to the *Guidelines* to extend the rebate offer period, allow additional time to apply for a program rebate and other minor clarifying changes. Under the current *Guidelines*, the rebate offer period started on April 22, 2010 was set to close on May 23, 2010 and applicants were allowed 30 days to submit their applications from the time they purchased their qualifying appliance. As a result of exceptional demand for high efficiency appliances nationally, appliance manufacturers are not able to provide adequate supply of qualifying appliances to California in a timely fashion and retailers are not able to provide delivery of purchased appliances to consumers for as much as eight weeks in some cases. Such constraints have resulted in consumers not being able to apply for their rebates until after the 30 day time requirement of the current *Guidelines*. The proposed changes would allow additional time for consumers to apply for a rebate by changing the time required to submit an application from 30 days to 120 days and extend the rebate offer period beyond May 23<sup>rd</sup> until funds are exhausted to address this supply chain problem.
