Applicant Hydrogen Energy International LLC (Applicant) hereby files its Status Report 7 with respect to the Hydrogen Energy California Project (HECA).

Coordination of HECA and Oxy CO₂ EOR Projects

Occidental Petroleum Corporation, on behalf of its subsidiary, Occidental of Elk Hills, Inc. (OEHI), has submitted to the CEC documentation regarding its proposed CO₂ enhanced oil recovery (EOR) project (Oxy CO₂ EOR Project). OEHI is proposing to extend existing EOR operations at the Elk Hills Unit by using CO₂ captured and transported from the HECA Project to facilitate oil production, resulting in sequestration of the CO₂. This data submission included OEHI's CO2 EOR Preliminary Project Description (Pre-FEED Stage), responses to CEC Staff's subsurface-related questions raised in correspondence from CEC dated March 4, 2010, a sample Class II UIC Permit Application (non-confidential), and reports of technical studies and academic white papers analyzing the potential for CO₂ EOR as a form of sequestration. A proposed monitoring, reporting and verification (MRV) protocol is still under development by OEHI with input from third party environmental stakeholders. It is currently expected that the MRV protocol will be provided to the CEC by the end of July. These submissions, together with additional information that may be requested by CEC Staff, will allow Staff to complete its review of the Oxy CO₂ EOR Project.

Discovery

Applicant received Staff Data Request Set 1 on October 12, 2009. Certain objections and requests for additional time to respond were filed on November 2, 2009. Subject to the stated objections and requests for additional time, responses to the remainder of Data Request Set 1 were timely filed on November 12, 2009. On December 11, 2009, Applicant filed responses to Staff Data Requests 1, 2,

6 and 19, for which Applicant had requested additional time to respond. On February 1, 2010, Applicant filed responses to Staff Data Requests 17, 65, 77 and 85 through 90, for which Applicant had requested additional time to respond. Also on February 1, 2010, Applicant submitted timely responses to CEC Staff Data Requests Set 2 (Nos. 133 through 152).

CEC Staff conducted a Data Request/Issues Resolution Workshop on April 12, 2010 in Tupman. Based on discussions during the Workshop, Staff made a number of informal data requests. Applicant provided responses to these additional requests on June 10, 2010.

Subject to objections to certain data requests, the Applicant has now responded to all outstanding CEC Staff data requests, both written and informal.

Applicant has not received any additional data requests from interveners.

Public Outreach

- HECA recently donated \$15,000 to programs aimed at western Kern County youths. HECA's charitable donation will be used for Elk Hills Elementary School's field trip to the California Science Center in Los Angeles, Buttonwillow Elementary School's annual science camp, a college scholarship through the Buttonwillow Chamber of Commerce, the Alpha House Women's Shelter and a grant to Cal State Bakersfield's Department of Geology to fund a student research project on carbon capture and storage.
- HECA was a sponsor of the 2010 Energy & Clean Air Expo in Bakersfield, organized by the Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce, which provided a unique opportunity for local business leaders to interact with key state and regional regulators, learn about pending regulations and offer feedback.
- HECA was a sponsor at the 10th annual Kern County Economic Summit held March 24 in Bakersfield. The event, presented by Kern Economic Development Corporation, Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce and Cal State Bakersfield, was dedicated to the issues impacting the county's economy, growth and diversification.
- In May, the Greater Bakersfield Chamber of Commerce board adopted a resolution on CCS and enhanced oil recovery (EOR). The board said new investments in low-emission power plants and integrated EOR could benefit California and Kern County through new energy projects, new jobs, reliable low emissions in-state electricity, increased local oil production and new local taxes.
- On May 4-6, 2010, HECA participated at DOE Wye Center Workshop on "Strategic Initiatives on CCS Deployment" and presented on HECA Project development experience.
- On May 9, 2010, HECA participated in U.S.-Canada Energy Dialogue with a focus on CCS.
- On May 10-13, 2010, HECA participated and presented at the annual NETL CCS Conference in Pittsburgh.
- On May 13-14, 2010, HECA participated and presented at the Global CCS Institute Members meeting.
- On May 12, 2010, HECA representatives were invited and met with the Obama Administration's Federal Interagency CCS Taskforce in Washington DC.
- On June 2, 2010, HECA participated and presented to the California Carbon Capture and Storage Review Panel in Sacramento, California.

- On June 9, 2010, HECA participated in the California CCS Coalition Board of Directors meeting.
- On June 10, 2010, HECA attended NRDC-EDF CCS Educational Workshop in Sacramento, CA, which was well attended by CPUC and CEC staff and other stakeholders.

Other Important Developments

- The SJVAPCD issued the PDOC for HECA on June 21, 2010.
- OEHI and HECA participated in a subsurface-focused CEC Workshop in Sacramento on May 21st. OEHI presented information related to their proposed CO₂ EOR project at the Elk Hills Field where the captured CO₂ from HECA will be used for EOR and sequestered, and answered questions from CEC staff, intervenors (Environmental Defense Fund, National Resource Defense Council) and the Department of Energy.
- On June 3, 2010, CPUC Board of Commissioners approved a Modification to the SCE application to provide clear direction for IOUs to jointly negotiate with HECA for power off-take.
- On June 29, 2010, Kern County approved cancellation of Williamson Act contracts applicable to the HECA project site.

Schedule

As indicated in Staff's Status Report 7, PSA Part 1 is expected in late July with PSA Part 2 to follow in August/September. Applicant is working diligently to ensure that staff has all information necessary to publish the PSA on schedule.
