

Staff Assessment-Draft Environmental Impact Statement Issue Resolution Workshops for the Rice Solar Energy Project (09-AFC-10)

The staff of the California Energy Commission with the participation of the Western Area Power Administration (Western) and U.S. Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will conduct two workshops in coordination with the applicant for the proposed Rice Solar Energy Project (RSEP). Other agencies expected to participate include U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Game. The workshops will allow an opportunity to discuss the Staff Assessment – Draft Environmental Impact Statement (SA-DEIS) prepared by Energy Commission staff, BLM, and. The workshops will provide an opportunity to resolve remaining issues and identify any information needed to supplement the record. These workshops will have provisions for remote teleconferencing access as well as accommodations for those wishing to participate inperson. The two workshops are scheduled to be conducted at the Energy Commission's offices in Sacramento on the following dates and times, and are accessible for participating in-person or via remote teleconferencing as follows:

Purpose

The purpose of the workshops is to allow the applicant, staff, BLM, Western, other interested agencies, and the public to discuss the SA-DEIS prepared by Energy Commission staff, BLM, and Western concerning areas of disagreement and any information needed to supplement the record.

- <u>Workshop #1</u> The topic areas to be discussed during Workshop #1 on September 28, 2010 will be engineering technical areas and could include: air quality, alternatives, hazardous materials, noise and vibration, public health and safety, soil and water resources, traffic and transportation, transmission line safety and nuisance, waste management, worker safety and fire protection, geology/paleontology/minerals, transmission system engineering and other topic areas as needed.
- <u>Workshop #2</u> The topic areas to be discussed during Workshop #2 on September 30, 2010 will be environmental areas and could include: biological resources, cultural resources, land use, socioeconomics, visual resources, and other topic areas as needed.

These discussions will help narrow outstanding issues between the applicant, and the agencies consisting of BLM, Western and staff, as the parties prepare for Evidentiary Hearings scheduled for October 11 and 12, 2010 and as noticed separately.

Background

On October 21, 2009, Rice Solar Energy, LLC (applicant) submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to construct and operate the Rice Solar Energy Project (RSEP). RSEP would be a 150-megawatt solar thermal power plant located mostly on private land. Review of this proposed project is currently in the analysis phase of a joint state and federal agency environmental and engineering review proceeding. The Energy Commission is the lead state agency for evaluating environmental impacts of a proposed licensing action under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The SA-DEIS, the result of the Energy Commission staff's environmental evaluation process, is functionally equivalent to the preparation of an Environmental Impact Report. Western, on behalf of the Department of Energy (DOE), is the lead federal agency evaluating environmental impacts of the proposed project under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) as associated with the electrical interconnection to Western's transmission system. The transmission line proposed to connect the proposed project is located partially on public lands managed by the BLM and would require a right-of-way grant and land use plan amendment to allow project use of those lands. For this reason, BLM is a cooperating agency in evaluating environmental impacts of the proposed project under NEPA.

Project Description

The proposed RSEP project is a solar electric generating facility to be located on approximately 1,410 acres in eastern Riverside County, California, immediately south of State Route (SR) 62, about 1 mile east of the junction with Blythe-Midland Road. RSEP would be a 150-megawatt (MW) concentrating solar thermal power project with a central receiver tower, sun-tracking heliostat field and an integral thermal storage system using

molten salt as the heat transfer and storage medium. When electricity is to be produced, the heated salt would be routed to a steam generation system, which supplies steam for use in a high-efficiency reheat steam turbine-generator. With thermal storage, RSEP would produce power according to periods of peak demands including hours when there is no collection of energy from the sun.
