Randi stated that CDFG did not intend provide a letter of comment on the AFC. CDFG felt that they have been communicating with us and the applicant regarding their position on the issue and they would like to wait until the PSA is published to make any comments on how the issue is handled in our document. Randi stated that for OGS the nitrogen deposition issue is not as clear as for the Marsh Landing Generation Station (MLGS) project as the MLGS site is located much closer to the Antioch Dunes National Wildlife Refuge. She stated that the threshold we used seems appropriate (6.39 kg/ha/yr). They would like to wait and see what the dispersion modeling shows for OGS on ADNWR to see if this is something they are concerned about. I told her that I would relay the information to Heather Blair and that if Heather felt like an additional conversation with her was needed since Heather will be addressing the nitrogen issue for the OGS project she would be in touch. I had also inquired earlier in an email (sent 9/29/2010) regarding the timing for the verification of a condition of certification that requires a Wetland E Post-construction management plan be prepared upon project approval as both CDFG and the Energy Commission will be reviewing the document. Randi stated that what I proposed would be sufficient (submitting a draft 60 days prior to the start of any construction-related ground disturbance for review of the document and submitting a final document at least 30 days prior to the start of any

construction-related ground disturbance).

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
