Dear Commissioners

I have installed at my home in Hesperia, California, six DycoCore wind generators and I have submitted all the proper forms which is required by the Energy Commission Staff. I paid in full for this equipment and it's installation out of my personal retirement funds which I was assured by your Staff would be returned in the form of a rebate.

Prior to committing to the installation of these units, I contacted your Staff member, who identified himself as Jim, inquiring about the qualifications of DycoCore and its units. Jim informed me that DycoCore did in fact meet all the requirements and standards. I was told to submit an R1 form and I would be qualified for rebate. He also informed me of other required forms and where in The Energy Resources website I could find DycoCore's information and qualifications.

I submitted the R1 form and within a couple of weeks received an R2 form stating I was granted a reservation of \$28,800. Receiving this contract from your Staff, I signed the proper paperwork and the installation process began. On July, 15<sup>th</sup> 2011, installation was completed and all approvals to operate were received. At that time all necessary and required paperwork was submitted to your Commission for rebate. Now I am informed that you will not give me the rebate because a complaint has been file against DycoCore.

First of all, let me state, it is my feeling that your Commission entered into a contract with me for a rebate of \$28,800 by providing me with a R2 form. If in fact DycoCore does not meet you requirements for rebates, this should have been discovered by your

staff prior to placing DycoCore on your list of qualified venders. The fact that your Staff did not perform their job properly is in no way my and your other constituents doing nor should we be held responsible. You as Commissioners have taken an oath to protect us, the consumers, from harm. I know this to be true as I myself have sat on many Commissions and Boards during my time in Politics.

PLEASE honor your commitment for rebates to us your constituents who are depending on these funds to survive in this rocky economy. If in fact DycoCore does not qualify or if they gave false information, then your argument is with DycoCore. Rebate us consumers as promised and go after DycoCore for any lost funds.

I plan to attend your Prehearing Conference on September 19, 2011 and would be grateful if I were allowed to speak and submit any forms required by your board.
