## **Energy Commission's Role**

- Energy Commission Permitting Authority
  - Thermal power plants "50 Megawatts or Greater"
  - Related facilities:
    - electric transmission lines
    - water supply pipelines
    - natural gas pipelines
    - access roads
- Lead state agency for California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

## 1. Data Adequacy


 Minimum requirements to accept AFC and begin 12month licensing proceeding

## 2. Discovery and Analyses


- Issues Identification

- Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD)
- PMPD hearing and Commission decision




# **Discovery and Analysis Process**

- Determine if proposal complies with Laws,
   Ordinances, Regulations, Standards (LORS)
- Conduct engineering and environmental analyses
  - identify issues and analyze project impacts
  - evaluate alternatives
  - identify mitigation measures to off-set project impacts
  - recommend conditions of certification
- Facilitate public and agency participation
- Staff products: Preliminary Staff Assessment (PSA) and Final Staff Assessment (FSA)
- Make recommendations to the Committee

## **Evidentiary Hearing & Decision Process**


- Committee conducts hearings on all information
  - Issues Presiding Member's Proposed Decision (PMPD)
  - PMPD contains findings relating to:
    - Environmental impacts, public health, engineering
    - Project's compliance with LORS
    - Recommends conditions of certification
    - Recommends whether or not to approve the project
- Full Commission makes final decision
- Energy Commission monitors compliance with all conditions of certification, for the life of the project through de-commissioning and closure



# Local, State and Federal Agencies

- Staff works closely with local, state and federal agencies, for example:
  - Local/Regional
    - Inyo County Planning, Env. Health, Sheriff's Department
    - Southern Inyo Fire Protection District / Pahrump Fire Rescue
    - Great Basin Unified Air Pollution Control District
  - State
    - California Department of Fish & Game
    - Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board
  - Federal
    - U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service
    - U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
    - Bureau of Land Management







# Staff's Issues Identification Report

## Purpose

- Inform participants, Commissioners of potential issues
- Early focus on important topics, areas of concern

### Criteria

- Significant impacts that may be difficult to mitigate
- Non-compliance with LORS
- Conflicts between parties about appropriate findings or conditions of certification for Commission decision that could delay schedule



## **POTENTIAL ISSUES**

- \* Biological Resources
- Cultural Resources
- Socioeconomics (Law Enforcement, Fire & Safety)
- \* Water Resources
- Visual Resources



# POTENTIAL ISSUE Biological Resources

- Federal and State Protected Species, including Desert Tortoise and Golden Eagles
- Multi-agency Mitigation Development
- Implementation of Mitigation for Potential Significant Impacts



# **POTENTIAL ISSUE**Cultural Resources

- Potential for of Unanticipated Discoveries of Cultural Resources
- Sacred Site ethnographic determinations based upon Native American consultation is ongoing
- Mitigation of Potential Significant Impacts



# POTENTIAL ISSUE Socioeconomics

- The ability of local law enforcement and emergency medical providers to respond to calls at the project site could be constrained
- The project's remote location combined with the limited resources of medical and fire responders could combine to make timely emergency response difficult



# POTENTIAL ISSUE Water Resources

- Pumping effects on groundwater basin levels
- Pumping effects on existing wells
- Cumulative impacts to groundwater basin



# POTENTIAL ISSUE Visual Resources

- 750 foot height of dual "power towers"
- Potential impacts on view-sheds from California and Nevada
- Mitigation of Potential Significant Impacts
