SUBJECT:	Enrollment and Capacity at Pahrump Valley Schools within the Nye County School District								

I spoke with Cameron McRae, Director of Transportation & Maintenance Operations, Nye County School District. The following are notes from our conversation:

- Schools in the Nye County School District widely range in size from a single classroom school to a school with 40 to 50 classrooms, so we focused our discussion on Pahrump Valley schools.
- Count day was September 23, 2011.
- There are four elementary schools with a total enrollment of 1,870 students. The Pahrump Valley schools are Floyd Elementary (420 students), J.G. Johnson Elementary (502 students), Manse Elementary (542 students), and Hafen Elementary (406 students). There is excess available capacity of 500 students.
- Middle school includes grades 6<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>. There are 1,042 students in the middle schools and an excess available capacity of 200 students.
- There is one high school, Pahrump Valley High, with an excess available capacity of 200-400 students and an enrollment of 1,330 students. A new addition to the high school is currently in construction and is anticipated to be completed in December 2011. At that time, all students will be moved into the "New" addition as a part of Phase I. Under Phase II, the existing high school will be remodeled and once completed in late 2012; the 9<sup>th</sup> graders will be moved back into the newly remodeled school.
- With the completion of Phase II, Pahrump Valley High would have a total capacity for 1,600 students.
