## Background

The Public Resources Code requires the Energy Commission to prepare and adopt an Integrated Energy Policy Report (IEPR), every two years beginning in 2003, with an update in the intervening years. The IEPR presents an assessment of all aspects of

energy supply, demand, production, transportation, delivery, distribution, and price. The objective of the IEPR is to evaluate market trends and develop energy policies that will "conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety." (Public Resources Code § 25301[a])

The Energy Commission issued a scoping order for the *2011 IEPR* on March 30, 2011, which identified topics to be covered in the report, including opportunities to increase the installation of renewable distributed generation projects on state property. The report outlines the current amount of renewable energy development on state properties, challenges and opportunities for further development, and next steps. A staff draft dated April 2011 was discussed at an IEPR workshop held May 9, 2011. The report was subsequently updated to reflect public comments and market developments.
