SUBJECT: Response to CEC's law enforcement needs assessment letter		

I received the following email from Edward Zwibel, Community Relations Officer with the Eastern Division of the San Diego Police Department. Mr. Zwibel's email was sent in response to CEC staff request for information about the police department's resources and any additional needs they may have so they can provide law enforcement service to the project while maintaining acceptable response times. The following is Mr. Zwibel's email:

§ The nearest law enforcement facility with jurisdiction for the project is the Eastern Division of the San Diego Police Department. We are located at 9225 Aero Drive, San Diego CA 92123. Our nearest dispatch facility, in fact our only dispatch facility, is housed in police headquarters at 1401 Broadway, San Diego CA 92101.

§ Our adopted service standard, while not our desired standard, is 1.4 officers currently per 1,000 citizens, as applicable to the project site.

§ Our average response times to the project site are as follows:

- o Emergency calls - 6.7 minutes
- o Priority 1 calls - 11.0 minutes
- o Priority 2 calls - 19.1 minutes
- o Priority 3 calls - 46.1 minutes
- o Priority 4 calls - 50.0 minutes

§ We have no additional needs beyond those identified to maintain or meet existing service levels with the project.

§ There are no formal / informal agreements with local municipalities or entities for the provision of police services within the project area.

§ Our current inventory of specialized aircraft are:

- o 4 helicopters and two fixed wing aircraft

§ There is no formal process or formula used by our department to determine the need for additional law enforcement services to serve a new large-scale power plant due to the scarcity of such plants within the City of San Diego proper.

§ The project could trigger a need for more law enforcement services during the construction phase by providing materials currently sought by commercial burglars and metal recyclers. Copper, precious metals, electrical transmission lines and valuable metals are a current high frequency target. This can be mitigated through the provision as stated of onsite security personnel.

§ I don't believe that traffic increases are going to impact the project except possibly during the construction phase. The project is in very close proximity to an state route on ramp and off ramp. Neighborhood impact should be minimal.

§ We do review development site plans for security and law enforcement issues. Volunteer Ted Parker can be reached at tparker@pd.sandiego.gov for a review.

§ Specific measures recommended to reduce the potential for crimes to occur at or near the project site can be addressed by Mr. Parker. Important to note, the project is bordered by a highly visited park in Mission Trails Park, and the Sycamore Open Space on the landfill border. These are frequented by joggers, mountain bikers and ample access exists for these people to approach the project from all sides. Adequate perimeter fencing and signage will be critical.

§ This site would also be considered "Critical Infrastructure" and we would recommend solicitation of the Department Of Homeland Security conducting a site assessment and full "Infraguard" type evaluation. This project can be viewed as a potential target for attack by a terrorist or organized criminal group.
