As a resident of the adjoining community of Santee, I would like to express my displeasure with this proposal.

Initially, this project may be construed as a healthy alternative to a coal burning plant that could be built, therefore making this a "good idea". This is anything but a good idea.

The proposed location, environmental issues, and financial strains on residents, is preposterous! No power plant, natural gas, coal, nuclear, etc. should be placed as close as this project is to a high school, residences and a regional park.

The proposed production rate is tenuous at best. Cogentrix, the company spear heading this project has stated a 43 percent rate while admitting that 58 percent is most probable. It would be appreciated if the commission would consider that this plant will probably run at 100 percent in an effort to recoup the \$150 million investment they would be making.

In regards to the proximity to schools, residences and the regional park, consideration should be given to the exhausting of carbon monoxide, VOC's, sulfur, particulates and ammonia, being spread across a 15-20 mile radius.
