BACKGROUND

AFC Section 4.3 states that short-term nighttime ambient noise measurements were conducted at two of the project's noise-sensitive residential receptors, designated as ST-1 and ST-2. The measurements were ½-hour samples taken from 10 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. at ST-1 and from 10:45 p.m. to 11:15 p.m. at ST-2. These locations represent the closest residential neighborhood to the proposed project site (AFC Figure 4.3-5). For residential receptors, staff typically uses the average of the nighttime noise levels between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. to assess a project's nighttime impacts at these locations. The short-term data presented in the AFC is not sufficient to make this assessment. Therefore, staff requests the following information.

DATA REQUEST

65. Please conduct a continuous ambient noise survey at locations ST-1 and ST-2 from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. and submit the results of this survey to staff, in terms of Leq, L10, L50, and L90.

Technical Area: Public Health

Health Risk Assessment BACKGROUND

The Application for Certification (AFC) and appendices provide some information on how the applicant conducted the health risk assessment. The potential impacts associated with emissions of toxic pollutants to the air from the proposed power plant were addressed in a health risk assessment (Section 4.8 Public Health and Appendix F.4). This health risk assessment was prepared using guidelines developed by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment and the California Air Resources Board, as implemented in the latest version of the HARP (Hotspots Analysis and Reporting Program) model (Version 1.4d). It was written in AFC page 4.8-11 that "detailed risk and hazard values are provided in the HARP output presented in Health Risk Assessment CD (Appendix F.4)." However, there is no such CD included in the AFC. The only information available for staff is some printed health risk assessment support data such as locations of sensitive receptors in Appendix F.4. Staff needs the files of health risk assessment support data, such as modeling input data and HARP results, to review and confirm the adequacy of the health risk assessment.

DATA REQUEST

66. Please provide all files of input data for HARP, including (but not limited to) the Source Receptor file (*.SRC), the Dilution Factors file (*.XOQ), the Emissions File (*.EMS), the Map file (*.MAP), the refined maximum ground level concentration (GLC) files (*.CSV), and all other related files which can help staff review and replicate the health risk assessment.

67. Please also provide all the output files generated from HARP, including (but not limited to) results for acute and chronic inhalation and chronic non-inhalation exposures, cancer burden and individual cancer risk (workplace and residential) for the combustion sources. Please also provide separate calculations for each type of exposure and risk, and the results of the calculations.

Technical Area: Visual Resources

BACKGROUND

The staff's visual assessment is based on illustrations (photographs, photographic simulations, etc.) of "representative views" neither understating nor overstating the visual effects of the proposed project.

The selected key observation point (KOP) existing condition/view photograph, and the KOP photographic simulation are to be prepared using a "normal" or "standard" lens, and to appear at "life-size scale" when viewed approximately 18 inches from the eye (standard reading/viewing distance) printed on 11" x 17" sized paper. There should be no visual disconnect between what is seen on the KOP existing view photograph, KOP photographic simulation and what is viewed in the field at the KOP.

- 68. Please provide an electronic file that contains key observation point 1 (KOP 1) showing the existing condition without the proposed project capable of color print out on 11"x 17" sized paper.
- 69. Please provide an electronic file that contains KOP 1 showing the existing condition that includes the photographic simulation of the proposed project capable of color print out on 11" X 17" sized paper.
- 70. Please provide electronic files of the photographs used for Viewpoints 1 through 7 in the AFC visual resources section capable of color print out on 11" X 17" sized paper.
