# Subject: HIDDEN HILLS SOLAR ELECTRIC GENERATING SYSTEM (11-AFC-2) STATUS REPORT #4

Per the November 16, 2011 Committee scheduling order, Energy Commission staff hereby file Status Report #4 for the Hidden Hills Solar Electric Generating System (HHSEGS).


Given the brief period of time that has elapsed since the Committee was last updated on the status of this proceeding (at the April 3, 2012, Status Conference), this report will focus on the primary technical areas of the Preliminary Staff Assessment (PSA) on which staff continues to work. Additionally, as in all previous Status Reports, an updated schedule is included in the attached indicating staff's commitment to publish its PSA on or before May 24, 2012.

#### PROCEEDING UPDATE


On April 2, 2012, Applicant filed its Boiler Optimization (Design Change) Plan. The Design Change would move the 230kV onsite switchyard and natural gas meter station from the Common Area (depicted below in AFC Figure 3.2-1) east into an undisclosed, offsite area in Nevada. While the change in location of the switchyard is reported to be attributable to new direction the applicant received from the Bureau of Land Management regarding offsite transmission linears, several new issues have arisen that will now need to be resolved by staff. The Applicant indicated in its April 2, 2012 filing that no significant impacts would result from the Design Change in any technical area (and in fact would be reduced in the area of Visual Resources given the elimination of above-ground transmission poles). However, staff is nonetheless concerned and seeks to resolve questions in several areas, including:

<u>Biological Resources / Soil Resources</u>: will the trenching required to underground transmission lines from Solar Field 1 and Solar Field 2 transect key ephemeral washes that constitute state and federal waters (especially along the California/Nevada border)?

<u>Traffic and Transportation</u>: will the new undergrounded transmission configuration From both Solar Plant 1 and Solar Plant 2 necessitate new or additional roads?



<u>Transmission System Engineering</u>: Absent a revised one-line diagram and a revised switchyard configuration, will key Phase II study findings/recommendations from the CAISO need to be revised? For your information, AFC Figure 3.2-1 (below) depicts the originally-proposed location of the 230 kV Switchyard and 230kV Transmission Lines.






Figure 3.2-1

Another area of concern by Energy Commission staff involves development standards along Tecopa Road, which runs along the southern boundary of Solar Field 2 and the proposed project site. The applicant states that a 20 foot set-back from Tecopa Road is necessary and appropriate, whereas Inyo County staff has indicated 25-50 feet plus additional (10 feet) right-of-way<sup>1</sup>. Given unknown glint/glare issues from the proposed project to passing motorists on Tecopa Road (clarification for which was asked of the Applicant in Data Request Set 2E issued on April 5, 2012), it is important that various technical staff (including Land Use, Traffic & Transportation and Visual Resources) obtain data responses.

Lastly, staff did take the opportunity to issue one last round of Data Requests (Set 2E) on April 5, 2012 as part of Discovery. The data requests were made in the areas of Biological Resources (Burrowing Owl), Land Use (development standards and set back requirements along Tecopa Road, and a decommissioning and reclamation inquiry), Public Health (inquiry regarding input data for Applicant's 2011 Ambient Air Quality Modeling and Screening Health Risk Assessment File), and Traffic and Transportation and Visual Resources (glint/glare issue with passing motorists along Tecopa Road mentioned earlier).

All of the above-listed technical areas (as well as <u>Socioeconomics</u> and <u>Water Resources</u> issues discussed in previous Status Reports and Status Conferences) will be discussed at the upcoming Issues Resolution Workshop on April 26, 2012 in Sacramento. In terms of Socioeconomics, staff continues to work with Inyo County staff to better understand and determine fiscal impacts related to HHSEGS. Accordingly, staff will need to obtain data to determine what portion of property and sales tax revenues will be paid to Inyo County by the applicant in order to offset the County's demonstrated increase in county services and costs.
