> Greetings Bob,

>  
> The purpose of this e-mail is to update the CEC on the status of the CPV Vaca Station  
Energy Center. As I mentioned to you on our telephone conversation last week, CPV continues

to see the Vaca Station Energy Center as its most important development opportunity in the PG&E territory. Our meetings with PG&E this year have confirmed that the Vaca Station location is a valuable strategic location that will be strengthened with near-term transmission upgrades approved in the area. We do, however, believe that the need in PG&E territory is not immediate, and we are controlling development spending, while maintaining the development status of Vaca Station until the market need matures. To that end, we are now negotiating with the City of Vacaville to extend our Site Option to Lease Agreement with them. We expect the amendment to that agreement to be executed before the end of the year. Regarding our CEC AFC, we request to continue on under our current status so that we can ramp our permitting efforts back up when the market shows signs of a developing opportunity.
