

Public Comment on Canyon Power Plant AQ-2 Amendment.

On Monday, June 18, 2012 an e-mail was received by staff from the Public Adviser's Office (PAO).

The PAO received a phone call from Christopher Walker from B & C Awnings, Inc., in Anaheim.

Mr. Walker had received the project amendment notice, and he was highly irritated and totally opposed to this project.

Staff contacted Mr. Walker on June 18, 2012, and talked to him about his concerns. Staff also discussed the amendment with him and assured him that the CO emissions increase was within the limits of the South Coast Air Quality Management District's permit. Staff also discussed the procedure for participating in the Business Meeting process at the Energy Commission—filling out the Information Request Form being the first step.

Mr. Walker said he would fill out the Information Request Form and send it to staff.

Staff did not receive an Information Request Form from Mr. Walker.

On August 21, 2012, staff called to talk to Mr. Walker about his phone call in June concerning the amendment being filed by Canyon to increase the CO start-up limit.

The person that answered the phone told staff that Mr. Walker was in conference. Staff told her Mr. Walker's concerns were important and staff would like to speak with Mr. Walker to make sure his concerns had been addressed. She said Mr. Walker would return staff's call if he still had issues with the proposed amendment. She then said the City of Anaheim had been very attentive to them and had answered questions for them. She seemed very satisfied with the project.

Mr. Walker had not returned the call as of 09/07/2012.
