Background

On August 29, 2011, Quail Brush Genco, LLC submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to the California Energy Commission seeking permission to construct and operate a nominal 100-megawatt (MW) intermediate/peaking load, electrical generating facility that would employ a set of 11 natural gas-fired, reciprocating, Wartsila engine generators to be called the Quail Brush Generation Project (QBGP). The QBGP is proposed to be developed on a 21.6-acre parcel, located in the city of San Diego. The proposed site is located west of the city of Santee, south of the Sycamore landfill, and north of State Route 52.

Summary

The Energy Commission assigned a Committee of two Commissioners to conduct proceedings on the AFC. The Committee held a public site visit and informational hearing at the City of San Diego Mission Trails Visitor Center on January 25, 2012, to discuss the review process and to identify issues that could affect the schedule. Pursuant to Title 20, California Code of Regulations, section 1709.7(c), the Committee issued a schedule on March 5, 2012 based on Staff's proposed schedule and related discussions at the informational hearing. The schedule was subsequently revised in June. 2012.

This revised schedule is based upon developments since issuance of the last schedule. It contains a list of events that must occur in order to complete the certification process. This schedule covers the period up to the prehearing conference with the balance of the schedule to be determined at the prehearing conference. The Committee encourages the parties to consider this schedule an outer boundary and make their best efforts to complete the milestones ahead of these dates. Some deadlines may be contingent upon reviews to be conducted by federal, state, and local agencies. The Applicant must provide sufficient review time for the responsible agencies to meet the deadlines specified in the schedule.

Status Reports and Status Conferences

Through their status reports, the parties have advised the Committee of certain issues that have impacted the schedule. The attached revised schedule reflects revisions necessitated by those issues. It also includes status conferences and requires status reports to be submitted by all parties. Status reports shall inform the Committee whether or not case development is progressing satisfactorily, and bring potential schedule delays and other relevant matters to the Committee's attention.

Parties, interested persons and agencies, and the public may attend the status conferences in person in Hearing Room A at the Energy Commission or by telephone and/or by computer via our "WebEx" web conferencing system. Details on how to participate by WebEx, will be included in a subsequent Notice of Status Conference. Questions regarding public participation at the status conferences should be directed to the Public Adviser.

Public Adviser and Public Participation

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the Commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.
