Agenda

This workshop is to solicit public comments on the Lead Commissioner's Draft 2012 IEPR Update which covers the following topics:

- 1. A Renewable Action Plan that identifies actions to help California achieve its Renewables Portfolio Standard target of 33 percent renewable electricity by 2020.
- 2. Status reports on four activities initiated during the 2011 IEPR proceeding that were either completed or continued during 2012:
 - a. The Energy Commission's electricity and natural gas demand forecast for 2012-2022, which was adopted in June 2012.
 - b. Reports on the natural gas market outlook and trends, which were finalized and published in May 2012.
 - c. An assessment of market potential for increased development of combined heat and power facilities to meet the Governor's goal of 6,500 megawatts of combined heat

and power by 2030, which was finalized and released in June 2012, and a follow-up staff white paper identifying barriers to further combined heat and power development which was released in September 2012.

d. The Energy Commission's ongoing assessment of electricity infrastructure in Southern California needed to meet future electricity demand and provide reliable service.

After considering all oral and written comments from the workshop, the Lead Commissioner will release the proposed final *2012 IEPR Update* at the end of January 2013. The report will be considered for adoption by the Energy Commission at its February 13, 2013, business meeting.

Background

Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the Energy Commission to prepare an *IEPR* every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. The Energy Commission uses these assessments and forecasts to develop energy policies that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety.

In the year following publication of the biennial *IEPR*, the Energy Commission is required to publish an energy policy review to provide updated information and analyses on topics covered in the biennial *IEPR* or identify new energy issues that have arisen since publication of the *IEPR*. The Draft *2012 IEPR Update* was prepared in response to this requirement.

The IEPR Lead Commissioner issued a scoping order on February 22, 2012, that identified topics that would be covered in the report. Eleven public workshops were held between February and June 2012 on a variety of topics, including combined heat and power, electricity and natural gas demand forecast, the impacts of climate change on the energy system, the renewable action plan, and electricity infrastructure issues in southern California.
