## **COMMENTS**:

I talked to Mr. Obray and Mr. Forrest about RV/Trailer Park space availability for relocated construction workers that would be needed to build the Rio Mesa SEGF. They said the busiest time of year is January through April though they usually have RV spaces available year-around. The winter rate is \$275 per month otherwise its \$125 per week. They have 145 spaces for use and there are four other RV parks in the local area. During the summer (April through September) a maximum stay of two weeks is allowed. Users can leave for two weeks and return for another stay. Other parks such as Hidden Beach River Resort have no limits on how long a site/space can be utilized. Both gentlemen believe that these parks could accommodate any relocated construction worker for the Rio Mesa SEGF who wanted to bring his/her RV to the local area. Several solar construction workers are currently staying at the Mayflower Park.
