Lisa and Amanda:

The city owns 778.41 acres of parkland. The beaches comprise 207.99 acres of that total. These are the figures the city used for our study and implementation of the parkland fees.

The city also has several joint use agreements, utility easements and lease-holdings providing additional parkland to just slightly exceed the 5 acres/1,000 metric set out in the General Plan. If we include the non-owned parkland the acreage totals 1,062.39.

The estimated census population for HB in 2011 is 192,888.

Chapter 17.65 FAIR SHARE TRAFFIC IMPACT FEE The city's Transportation Dept. has determined that this fee is not applicable to this project.

Chapter 17.67 LIBRARY DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES This fee is applicable to the project.

Chapter 17.74 FIRE FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEE This fee is applicable to the project.

Chapter 17.75 POLICE FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES This fee is applicable to the project.
