As part of the 2013 Integrated Energy Policy Report (2013 IEPR), the California Energy Commission's IEPR Lead Commissioner and the Siting Lead Commissioner will conduct a workshop to (1) discuss environmental and land use attributes used in the California Public Utilities Commission's Long-Term Procurement Plan scenario development process; and (2) seek input from stakeholders on the attributes needed for a comprehensive, transparent, public in-state and out-of-state renewable energy project database that serves multiple agency and stakeholder needs.

Agenda

This workshop addresses Recommendation #9 in the Renewable Action Plan (Chapter 5 of the 2012 Integrated Energy Policy Report Update), which directs the Energy Commission to ensure that environmental and land-use information developed through relevant sources is incorporated into renewable resource scenarios used in the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) Long-Term Procurement Plan proceeding and the California Independent System Operator (California ISO) Transmission Planning Process. Recommendation #9 also directs the Energy Commission to continue to develop its in-state and out-of-state renewable project databases via a public, transparent process that provides opportunities for stakeholder involvement. The purpose of this workshop is to discuss the goals and scope of this effort, data needs, possible sources of publicly available data, gaps in available information, any data collection issues, and possible options. Recommendation #9 is listed as one of the top ten Priority Actions for the Renewable Action Plan.

Background

The Energy Commission prepared a Renewable Action Plan as Chapter 5 of its 2012 IEPR Update. Strategy 3 (Minimize Interconnection and Integration Costs and Requirements) identified several challenges and opportunities associated with grid-level renewables integration. Recommendation #9 of the Renewable Action Plan notes that the Energy Commission must continue to develop its in-state and out-of-state renewable project databases, and these data should be collected and maintained through a transparent, public process that provides opportunities for stakeholder involvement. In accordance with a May 2010 Memorandum of Understanding between the California ISO and the CPUC, the CPUC coordinates with the Energy Commission to develop the renewable resource scenarios used by the California ISO in its annual Transmission Planning Process. In particular, the Energy Commission provides environmental and land use scoring for renewable generation projects as input to the CPUC. These scores are primarily developed using Energy Commission staff's Renewable Energy Action Team Generation Tracking Database. This database tracks siting details on renewable energy projects statewide and includes some data on out-of-state renewable energy projects. As part of the 2013 IEPR proceeding, the staffs of the Energy Commission and CPUC held a workshop on December 19, 2012 to discuss proposed renewable resource scenarios for the California ISO's 2013-2014 Transmission Planning process.
