#### COMMITTEE SCHEDULING ORDER

#### **Background**

Palo Verde Solar I, LLC submitted an Application for Certification for the Blythe Solar Power Project to the Energy Commission on August 24, 2009 (09-AFC-6). The Commission issued its Final Decision on September 15, 2010. The U.S. Bureau of Land Management published the Plan Amendment/Record of Decision on October 22, 2010 and issued the right-of-way grant on November 4, 2010. The Commission Decision permitted the construction and operation of a 1,000 MW solar thermal trough system utilizing heat transfer fluid to generate steam and drive steam turbine generators. The project footprint was 6,831 acres (the Approved Project).

Project ownership has changed, and the current owner, NextEra Blythe Solar Energy Center LLC, seeks to amend the Final Decision. The amendment includes replacing the parabolic trough solar collection system and associated heat transfer fluid and steam generating equipment with photovoltaic technology. Project output would be reduced to 485 MW, and its footprint would be reduced to 4,070 acres, entirely within the site of the Approved Project.

The Energy Commission has assigned a committee of two commissioners to conduct proceedings on the amendment. Section 25500.1 of the Warren-Alquist Act provides for an amendment which seeks to convert a facility from solar thermal technology to photovoltaic technology to be processed by the Energy Commission under section 1769 of commission regulations (Title 20, California Code of Regulations). Section 1769 provides for the appointment of a committee to conduct proceedings. Once the committee has concluded its proceedings, its findings concerning the amendment are to be submitted to the full commission for consideration.

The Committee has adopted the attached schedule for the review of the amendment. It contains a list of events that must occur in order to complete the review process. The Committee encourages the parties to consider this schedule an outer boundary and make their best efforts to complete the milestones ahead of these dates. Some

deadlines may be contingent upon reviews to be conducted by federal, state, and local agencies. The Applicant must provide sufficient review time for the responsible agencies to meet the deadlines specified in the schedule.

#### **Status Reports and Status Conferences**

The attached schedule requires status reports to be submitted by all parties. Status reports shall inform the Committee whether or not case development is progressing satisfactorily, and bring potential schedule delays and other relevant matters to the Committee's attention.

The reports shall be received by the other parties and the Commission's Docket Unit, 1516 Ninth Street, MS-4, Sacramento, California 95814-5512, **and must be filed no later than 3:00 p.m.**, on the due date. Status reports must contain "Docket No. 09-AFC-6C" in the caption or heading.

A status conference may be held by the Committee, at a date, time and place to be determined. The Committee will provide notice of any status conferences to all parties and the public.

#### Public Adviser and Public Participation

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.
