To Whom It May Concern:

On June 19, 2013, as part of the California Energy Commission's ("Energy Commission's") 2013 Integrated Energy Policy Report ("2013 IEPR") process, the Energy Commission held a Staff Workshop on California Nuclear Power Plant Issues ("the Workshop"). Southern California Edison ("SCE") participated in the Workshop and appreciates the opportunity to provide these written comments.

During the workshop, SCE representatives provided a briefing on the retirement plans for San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) and participated in a panel discussion on the relevant items from the AB 1632 Report / 2008 IEPR and 2011 IEPR Nuclear Policy Recommendations. These comments provide additional information in response to two questions asked during the Workshop.

First, in response to a question regarding the tonnage of used fuel generated at SONGS, SCE indicated the information was provided in response to IEPR Data Request III.D.1 in Table 12, "Waste Generated at SONGS (Unit 1, 2, and 3)." That data request response states that as of May 2013, SONGS had generated 1,556 metric tons of uranium. That tonnage includes 270 Unit 1 used fuel assemblies, which are stored at the General Electric Facility in Morris, IL.

Second, SCE was asked the percentage of nuclear fuel that has long term contracts for SONGS Units 2 and 3. All of the remaining nuclear fuel for SONGS Units 2 and 3 planned for use through 2022 has long term contracts.
