Dear Mr. Silsbee:

On July 22, 2013, the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) received Southern California Edison Company's (SCE) amended Electricity Demand Forecast Form 1.6a—Recorded Hourly Loads. SCE submitted an earlier version of the form on April 15, 2013 which reported loads at the generation level. At the Energy Commission's request, SCE revised the form to reflect hourly loads at the system operator level. SCE included with their amended July 22 submission a request that the Energy Commission extend its confidential designation to cover the revised load data.

Since SCE's revised form 1.6a reflects only a clarification to data previously submitted on April 15 and deemed confidential by the Energy Commission, the same confidential designation will be granted for the July 22 submission under the trade secret exemption to the California Public Records Act (Gov. Code, § 6254 (k); Evidence Code § 1060 et seq.).


We disagree that the data cannot be aggregated. Specifically, the Energy Commission will disclose SCE's bundled and direct access hourly loads for years 2012 and 2013 only after aggregating to the SCE transmission system area, including Electric Service Providers (ESP), Publicly Owned Utilities (POU), and other entities served by the SCE transmission system. The information will remain confidential until December 31, 2015.

Persons may petition to inspect or copy the records that I have designated as confidential. The procedures and criteria for filing, reviewing, and acting upon such petitions are set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2506. Finally, an appeal of this decision must be filed within 14 days from the date of this decision. The procedures and criteria for appealing any part of this decision are set forth in California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 2505.
