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These comments are being submitted to the California Energy Commission on its DRECP for myself.

- Shared usage of existing transmission lines, having extra capacity, at reasonable rates.
- No location of any solar or wind facilities in wildlife transition zones between the desert and the San Bernardino National Forest or any other like area. Examples: Granite Mountains and Cougar Buttes
- Low or no interest loans, grants and tax credits for individuals to solarize their homes. This would include mobile homes.
- Priority given to companies who utilize fallow agricultural land and other developed locations.
- Should the Commission approve new transmission lines, they should be required to be placed underground.
- All water sources (natural and manmade) within planned designated areas must be replaced outside the area designated prior to approval of any projects.
- Mining impacts are such small and localized areas that there should be no withdrawal of mineral entry.
- Rules should be developed individually for wind, solar and geothermal.
- Each project must go through some sort of CEQA process.
- The people who will be impacted must be involved in the project development and approval.

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
