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The *Estimated Cost of New Renewable and Fossil Generation in California* report is produced to provide planners and decision makers the information to aid in near- and long-range policy and procurement decisions. This Report summarizes the cost trends for utility-scale generation resources that may be built in California over the next decade. These include solar, wind, geothermal, biomass, and gas-fired technologies. Trends in technology, permitting, construction, and financing costs are considered. The instant and installed costs for each type of technology are presented for investor-owned, publicly owned, and merchant-owned generation resources. Finally, the levelized costs necessary to provide financial incentive for development is estimated using an updated Cost of Generation Model. These values are presented with both deterministic and probabilistic ranges of potential costs over the next 10 years.
