Background

The Energy Commission is conducting this workshop to gather stakeholder feedback on fugitive methane emissions in California's natural gas system. Methane (CH₄) is the second most prevalent greenhouse gas emitted in the United States from human activities. Methane is approximately 20 times more potent than carbon dioxide (CO₂) over

a 100-year time period and over 80 times more potent over a 20-year time period. Estimates of methane emissions from the natural gas system were 157.4 million metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent (MMT CO_2 Eq.) in 2013, up from 154.4 MMT CO_2 Eq. in 2012.¹ To ensure the economic and environmentally conscience use of natural gas, the California Legislature enacted AB 1257 (Bocanegra, Chapter 749, Status of 2013).

AB 1257 requires the Energy Commission to "evaluate the incremental beneficial and adverse economic cost and environmental impacts of proposed strategies, including life-cycle greenhouse gas emissions from production, transportation, and use of natural gas, based on authoritative, peer-reviewed, and science-based analysis or in consultation with the State Air Resources Board". The report will help inform policy makers and decisions regarding future state policies and research and development funding.
