### **Background**

The Building Energy Efficiency Standards (Standards) predate the initiatives resulting from Assembly Bill 758 (Skinner, Chapter 470, Statutes of 2009) and play an essential role in California's efforts to upgrade and improve the performance of its stock of existing buildings. These Standards establish the requirements that must be met when existing buildings are altered or added to, ensuring that existing buildings are gradually improved over time as they are remodeled, renovated, and rehabilitated.

As the Energy Commission moves to implement the 2016 Standards, there is an opportunity to examine and discuss ways to enhance the effect of these updates on existing buildings as well as the process for achieving compliance with the Standards.
