### **Background**

As required by Senate Bill 1389 (Bowen, Chapter 568, Statutes of 2002), the Energy Commission conducts "assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand and prices" (Public Resources Code, Section 25302(a)). The Energy Commission uses these assessments and forecasts to provide an analytical foundation for developing energy policies that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety. Developing energy policy recommendations on the most current and pressing energy issues facing the state, and across different markets and

systems, requires an evaluation of potential trade-offs that explicitly address inter-fuel and inter-market effects (Public Resources Code, Section 25302(b)).

On February 19, March 19, and June 24, 2015, the Energy Commission held workshops to present key assumptions and inputs, and a preliminary transportation energy demand forecast. These workshops provided an overview of the transportation energy demand forecasting process including:

- California's economic and demographic trends
- Overview of the proposed analytic approach
- Transportation fuel demand assumptions
- Crude oil, petroleum-based, and alternative fuel price forecasts
- Preliminary forecasts of light, medium, and heavy duty vehicle attributes
- Preliminary forecasts of transportation energy demand, including petroleum, alternative and renewable fuels

## **Agenda**

At the September 30, 2015 workshop, staff will present, discuss, and solicit public comments on revised sets of vehicle attributes for light, medium, and heavy duty vehicles based on three cases common to the electricity and natural gas forecasts developed by other Energy Commission staff. Topics will include:

- Review of three common cases and policies included in those cases.
- Forecasts of light duty vehicle attributes, including purchase price, fuel economy, maintenance cost, and range.
- Forecasts of medium and heavy duty vehicle attributes, including purchase price and fuel economy.
