### Background

California Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the Energy Commission to prepare an *IEPR* every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. The Energy Commission develops these assessments and forecasts of the state's electricity and natural gas markets, including statewide and regional electricity and natural gas demand, incorporating factors leading to future demand growth, such as

changes in economic activity, population growth, urban development, industrial expansion and energy intensity, growth in different building types, and energy and environmental policies.

As part of the energy demand forecast development, the Energy Commission will hold a workshop to gather information about California's economic and demographic outlook and how businesses and industries will be impacted by the uncertain economic climate.

### **Agenda**

At the January 24, 2017, workshop, there will be three panels of experts that will focus on California's economics/demographics, fuel prices, and business climate. The first panel of economic and demographic forecasters will discuss California's projected future economic situation and California's changing population characteristics. The second panel will discuss California transportation fuel prices and what changes can be expected in the near-term. The third panel will include business representatives from California that focus on the state's economy from the perspective of business and industry. A moderator will present questions covering major economic and demographic issues to three expert panels.

Time will be reserved at the end of each panel discussion for questions from the public. This workshop will provide an opportunity for energy demand forecasters, Energy Commission staff, and others to obtain further insight about possible economic and demographic outcomes in California. The information gained from this workshop will be used to enhance the 2017 California Energy Demand Forecast.
