Notice of IEPR Staff Webinar on Inputs, Assumptions, and Administrative Review for Publicly Owned Utility Integrated Resource Plans

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California Energy Commission staff will conduct a webinar to discuss inputs, assumptions, and administrative review related to developing guidelines for preparing, adopting, and submitting publicly owned utility (POU) integrated resource plans. Background

California Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the Energy Commission to prepare an IEPR every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. In addition, Senate Bill 350 (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) requires qualifying POUs to adopt integrated resource plans (IRPs) at least once every five years. SB 350 allows the Energy Commission to adopt guidelines to govern the submission of information, data, and reports needed to support the Energy Commission's review of the IRPs.

The Energy Commission released a staff paper entitled *Proposed Guideline Topics for Publicly Owned Utilities' Integrated Resource Plans,* and a lead commissioner workshop was held on the afternoon of February 23, 2017, as well as a follow-up webinar on March 13, 2017, to discuss the paper's contents with stakeholders. The staff paper describes the preliminary framework of the guidelines and solicits stakeholder input on staff's proposal. Written comments have since been

submitted and reviewed by staff, and will be used to inform the materials at the April 20, 2017, staff webinar.

Agenda

The staff webinar will discuss staff's proposed requirements and guidance on inputs, assumptions, and the administrative review process. This is the first step in developing draft guidelines for POU IRPs. The discussion will be interactive, with staff introducing proposed guideline language, followed by a public comment period. The webinar will conclude with a staff description of the process and schedule for moving forward with the development of draft guidelines.

The webinar will provide an opportunity for stakeholder discussion on the following topics:

- Staff proposed guideline topics:
 - o Submission and review process for POU IRPs
 - Required components of an IRP vs. discretionary components and analyses
 - o Standardized data reporting draft forms and instructions
 - Inputs and assumptions for POUs to consider in the development of IRPs
 - Alignment of GHG accounting methodology with AB 1110 Power Source Disclosure Program
- Next steps and schedule for the development of draft POU IRP guidelines
