Notice of IEPR Commissioner Workshop on the California Energy Demand 2018-2028 Preliminary Forecast

The California Energy Commission Lead Commissioner for Electricity and Natural Gas will conduct a workshop to explore a range of perspectives on the future of electricity demand in California over the next 10 years. Staff from the Energy Commission and load-serving entities (LSEs) will present and discuss their respective 10-year forecasts of electricity and natural gas consumption and electricity peak demand. Energy Commission staff will also present details regarding treatment of energy efficiency, self-generation, electricity rates, and climate change impacts on electricity demand.

Background

Energy Commission staff has developed 10-year forecasts of electricity and natural gas consumption and electricity peak demand for each major utility planning area within California. These forecasts will be published in a staff report prior to the workshop. To provide the Energy Commission and the public with an opportunity to consider alternative perspectives on demand trends, the Energy Commission requested electricity demand forecasts and related information from all LSEs with peak loads greater than 200 megawatts. These forecasts were submitted to the Energy Commission in April and will serve as a point of comparison to the preliminary staff forecast.

Following this workshop, staff will consider stakeholder comments along with direction from the IEPR Lead Commissioner in developing a set of revised forecasts to be used in a variety of energy policy and planning activities, notably the 2017 IEPR.

Parties who wish to propose alternative forecasts or question the assumptions and methods used by Energy Commission demand modelers should consider this workshop as an opportunity to contribute to the record of this proceeding.

Agenda

Staff presentations will cover the preliminary forecast and methods, including a new hourly load forecast model, distributed generation impacts, electricity rate scenarios, and individual utility forecasts. For all the topics to be discussed at this workshop, utilities are invited to provide comments or make presentations.
