Background

The *2013 IEPR* found that, despite its place alongside energy efficiency at the top of the loading order and the many benefits associated with DR, “insufficient progress” had been made towards meeting the state’s DR goals. The *2013 IEPR* further laid out a series of strategies designed to help DR meet its potential. Since 2013, progress has been made in some of these strategies, and additional analysis has occurred that explains and quantifies the potential of DR in California’s changing electric grid. The purpose of the workshop will be to hear from stakeholders what progress has been made in achieving the strategies laid out in the *2013 IEPR*, to explore remaining barriers to greater DR participation, and provide an update on DR’s potential benefits.

Agenda

Panels consisting of state officials, DR market participants and other stakeholders will give presentations and participate in panel discussion highlighting DR achievements since 2013 and identify barriers preventing further increased DR participation.
