## Notice of Joint Agency Workshop on Senate Bill 350 2030 Energy Efficiency Savings Doubling Targets

The California Energy Commission and the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) will jointly conduct a workshop to present and solicit feedback on a lead commissioner report containing the draft 2030 Energy Efficiency Savings Doubling Targets, as called for by Senate Bill 350, the Clean Energy and Pollution Reduction Act of 2015 (De León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) (SB 350). The workshop is part of the *2017 Integrated Energy Policy Report (2017 IEPR)* proceeding.

Energy Commission Chair Robert B. Weisenmiller is the Lead Commissioner for the *2017 IEPR* and will be joined by Commissioner J. Andrew McAllister of the Energy Commission. Representatives of the California Independent System Operator may also be in attendance. Other Commissioners from the Energy Commission and the CPUC may also attend and participate in the workshop. A quorum of Commissioners from the CPUC and/or the Energy Commission may be in attendance, but no votes will be taken.

### Background

On October 7, 2015, Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. signed SB 350 into law. The bill establishes new energy efficiency and renewable electricity targets by 2030 to support California's long-term climate

goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2050. Specifically, SB 350 requires that the Energy Commission adopt targets by November 2017 that achieve a statewide cumulative doubling of energy efficiency savings in gas and electric final end uses by 2030, to the extent doing so is cost effective, feasible, and will not adversely impact public health and safety. SB 350 stipulates that the Energy Commission must establish the energy efficiency savings doubling targets in a public process that involves the CPUC and the utilities.

The energy efficiency targets required by SB 350 are being developed as part of the 2017 IEPR. Public Resources Code Section 25302 directs the Energy Commission to adopt an IEPR every odd-numbered year and in even-numbered years issue an energy policy review to update analyses from the previous IEPR or to raise energy issues that have emerged since the previous proceeding.

On July 11, 2016, the Energy Commission held an initial workshop, involving the CPUC, utilities, and other stakeholders, on the the data and analytical needs related to doubling energy efficiency savings within the context of the IEPR demand forecast. On January 23, 2017, the Energy Commission and the CPUC held a joint workshop discussing with stakeholders a paper that laid out the policy and timing framework staff intended to follow to establish the energy efficiency savings targets called for by SB 350. In that paper and workshop, staff proposed dividing the energy efficiency savings target-setting work called for by SB 350 into two separate analyses—one by the Energy Assessments Division on targets for utility sources and one by the Efficiency Division on targets for other sources. A staff workshop was held on June 19, 2017, to discuss methodologies for target-setting. Additionally, on May 24, 2017, Energy Commission staff submitted for public review a preliminary draft of the SB 350 2030 Energy Efficiency savings doubling goal, along with the calculations used in developing the goal.

A draft report proposing SB 350 targets and recommendations to ensure the state meets these targets will be discussed with stakeholders in this workshop. After incorporating stakeholder input received, the Energy Commission, at a business meeting, will consider adoption of the report on the 2030 Energy Efficiency Savings Targets as called for by SB 350. The Commission Draft Report, titled *Senate Bill 350: Doubling Energy Efficiency Savings by 2030*, will be made available prior to the workshop at [http://www.energy.ca.gov/2017\\_energy\\_policy/documents/](http://www.energy.ca.gov/2017_energy_policy/documents/).

Updated numbers for some of the non-utility savings targets will subsequently be provided as a separate standalone document for stakeholder consideration at the workshop. The revisions will then be incorporated into the Commission Final Report, to be published prior to consideration of adoption.

## Agenda

This workshop will include Energy Commission and CPUC staff presentations and discussions on the SB 350 2030 energy efficiency savings doubling goal and targets. The workshop discussion will focus on the contents of the Energy Commission draft report, *Senate Bill 350: Doubling Energy Efficiency Savings by 2030*, as well as the revised non-utility savings targets described above.

**Oral Comments:** The Energy Commission will accept oral comments during the workshop. Public comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker and to one person per organization. Any comments will become part of the public record in this proceeding.
