Notice of IEPR Commissioner Workshop on the 2018 California Energy Demand Forecast Update

The California Energy Commission will hold a workshop to propose and discuss updates to the adopted 2017 IEPR energy demand forecast. Energy Commission staff will review the scope and method for the update, present the most recent data available for key forecast drivers, propose scenarios, and outline additional work that will be considered for the full 2019 IEPR forecast.

Commissioner David Hochschild is the Lead Commissioner for the 2018 Integrated Energy Policy Report Update (2018 IEPR Update). Robert B. Weisenmiller, the Chair of the Energy Commission and Lead Commissioner for electricity and natural gas, will conduct the meeting. A quorum of commissioners from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) or the Energy Commission may be attending, but no votes will be taken.

Background

The Energy Commission provides 10-year forecasts for electricity and natural gas demand every two years as part of the IEPR process. The IEPR forecasts are used in resource and system planning proceedings, including the Integrated Resource Planning process

conducted by the CPUC and the Transmission Planning Process conducted by the California Independent System Operator (California ISO).

The Energy Commission, CPUC, and California ISO are committed to working collaboratively across these proceedings, in part by agreeing to use a single set of demand forecasts. To avoid providing stale inputs into any of these critical planning processes, the Energy Commission updates the most recently-adopted IEPR forecast as part of the IEPR update process. The forecast update is limited in scope, retaining most of the characteristics of the IEPR forecast, but reflecting newly available load data, economic assessments, and projections of key demand modifiers.

Agenda

Energy Commission staff will make presentations describing:

- The overall process used to update the forecast
- Preliminary changes to key economic drivers
- Plans for revising projections of light-duty electric vehicle and behind-the-meter photovoltaic adoption
- Improvements planned to the Energy Commission's hourly demand model
- The implications of new and expanding community choice aggregation

Representatives from investor-owned utilities will discuss their outlook on community choice aggregation.

Finally, Energy Commission staff will outline improvements planned for the *IEPR 2019* forecast. There will be an opportunity for public comments at the end of the workshop as noted below. The workshop is expected to end in the early afternoon.
