## **Notice of Staff Workshop on the 2019 CALeVIP Projects Roadmap**

California Energy Commission staff will conduct a public workshop for the 2019 CALeVIP Projects Roadmap, a presentation of the plan to release four incentive projects in 2019 under the California Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Project (CALeVIP), which is funded by the Alternative and Renewable Fuel and Vehicle Technology Program (ARFVTP). The Commission is seeking input from stakeholders to inform the 2019 CALeVIP Projects Roadmap. Commissioners from the California Energy Commission may attend this workshop. ### **Background**

Assembly Bill 118 (Núñez, Chapter 750, Statutes of 2007), created the ARFVTP. The statute authorizes the Energy Commission to develop and deploy alternative and renewable fuels and advanced transportation technologies to help attain the state's climate change goals. Assembly Bill 8 (Perea, Chapter 401, Statutes of 2013) reauthorized the ARFVTP through January 1, 2024.

As of April 2018, the Energy Commission has invested nearly \$79.9 million through the ARFVTP for almost 8,700 charging connectors at public and private sites in California. To provide more focused plug-in electric vehicle (PEV) infrastructure projects that will target more specific projects and gaps in charging availability, the Energy Commission issued Grant Funding Opportunity (GFO)-16-603 to seek a block grant recipient to design and implement up to \$200 million in grant funds through various PEV charger

incentive projects throughout California. The Center for Sustainable Energy (CSE) was approved as the grant agreement recipient at the Energy Commission's April 2017 business meeting.

The first incentive project under CALeVIP, the Fresno County Incentive Project (FCIP), launched in December 2017 and offers rebates for the purchase and installation of level 2 chargers within Fresno County. FCIP is currently funded for \$4 million.

The second incentive project under CALeVIP, the Southern California Incentive Project, launched in August 2018 and offers rebates for the purchase and installation of DC fast chargers within the counties of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino. The Southern California Incentive Project is currently funded for \$29 million.

Energy Commission staff worked with CSE to develop the 2019 CALeVIP Projects Roadmap (2019 Roadmap), which is a plan to release four individual CALeVIP incentive projects in 2019. The 2019 roadmap details the four project regions, the timeline, the available funding and general requirements.

The four incentive projects, including their eligible regions are:

1. The Sacramento Incentive Project (Sacramento County).
2. The Northern California Incentive Project (Shasta, Humboldt, and Tehama counties).
3. The Central Coast Incentive Project (Santa Cruz, Monterey, and San Benito counties).
4. The Central Valley Incentive Project (Fresno, San Joaquin, and Kern counties).
  - a. FCIP will merge into the Central Valley Incentive Project.

Further details on the incentive projects will be discussed during the workshop. Energy Commission staff plans to hold four workshops, one in each of the four project regions, and present the same information at each workshop. **This workshop notice only includes the information for the Eureka workshop.** Information on the workshops for the Northern California, Central Coast, and Central Valley incentive project regions will be posted as they are scheduled.
