Assembly Bill 109 (Ting, Budget Act of 2017, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2017) provided \$6 million in Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund monies to the Energy Commission to support renewable energy projects in the agriculture sector to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Senate Bill 856 (Budget and Fiscal Review Committee, Chapter 30, Statutes of 2018) provided an additional \$4 million in funding for these purposes. To implement these efforts, the Energy Commission is developing the Renewable Energy for Agriculture Program as a competitive grant program to support the installation of onsite renewable energy projects to serve agricultural operations located in California. As a program funded through California Climate Investments, REAP is designed with the primary goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions, through projects that serve local communities, benefit public health and reduce air pollution.

The Renewable Energy for Agriculture Program (REAP) Draft Guidelines, Second Version, describe the proposed REAP program structure, eligibility criteria for selecting projects for funding, solicitation procedures, project implementation requirements, project reporting, and statutory requirements. Information gathered from public comments will inform the content of the proposed final program guidelines, which will be considered for adoption by the Energy Commission at a regularly scheduled business meeting.
