California Energy Commission staff will conduct a pre-rulemaking workshop to solicit stakeholder comment on proposed changes to the Power Source Disclosure (PSD) Program regulations, including those required by Assembly Bill 1110 (Ting, Chapter 656, Statutes of 2016), on:

Discussion topics will include:

- Review of draft PSD regulatory language,
- Greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions intensity factor methodology,
- Fuel mix methodology,
- Grandfathering provision for firmed-and-shaped imports,
- Draft versions of the updated power content label (PCL) and annual reporting templates, and
- Other potential revisions to the PSD program regulations, including auditing requirements and reporting of shared resources under Cost Allocation Mechanism agreements.

Additional topics may be added. The final agenda and related materials will be made available prior to the workshop.

Background

The California Energy Commission plans to institute a formal rulemaking to consider modifications to the Electricity Generation Source Disclosure regulations, Title 20, California Code of Regulations, Section 1390 et seg. These regulations implement a program referred to as the Power Source Disclosure Program and the regulations are referred to here as the PSD regulations. The PSD Program requires electricity retail suppliers to disclose to consumers the electricity sources in their products compared with the mix of electricity sources providing power for California. The PSD Program was initially authorized by Senate Bill 1305 (Sher, Chapter 796, Statutes of 1997), and has been updated through subsequent legislation. Under AB 1110, the PSD Program will also require electricity retail suppliers to disclose to customers the GHG emissions intensity of the retail supplier's electric service products and the quantity of unbundled RECs procured in association with its electric service products. Retail suppliers will begin disclosing GHG emissions intensities on the PCL in 2020 for 2019 calendar vear data. The planned rulemaking will address the statutory requirements of AB 1110 as well as revisions to clarify existing provisions, improve program operations, and streamline reporting requirements. Activities to amend the PSD regulations are currently in the pre-rulemaking phase. As needed, pre-rulemaking workshops are held by the Energy Commission to seek public input for developing and refining draft regulations. The formal rulemaking phase commences with the publication of a Notice of Proposed Regulatory Action and proposed regulations. Once adopted by the Energy Commission, the regulations will be submitted to the Office of Administrative Law for review. More information about the California rulemaking process can be found at
