Energy Commissioner Andrew McAllister will jointly conduct this workshop with CPUC President Michael Picker. A quorum may be in attendance, but no votes will be taken.

Agenda

This workshop will focus on building decarbonization issues and will include discussions on recent policy and program developments, particularly the Senate Bill 1477 (Stern, Chapter 378, Statutes of 2018) building decarbonization proceeding. Presentations will be given by Energy Commission staff, local governments, utilities, environmental organizations, and other stakeholders on building decarbonization issues generally, and on implementation of SB 1477 in particular. Background

On June 14, 2018, the Energy Commission held an IEPR workshop on building decarbonization that included presentations from CPUC staff on the subject. The 2018 IEPR Update included a chapter on the need to decarbonize buildings and recommended developing a plan to assess the feasibility

of significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions from buildings. In September 2018, former Governor Brown signed SB 1477, which calls on the CPUC to develop, in consultation with the Energy Commission, two programs (BUILD and TECH) to incent the installation of decarbonizing technologies in new and existing buildings in California. Also in September 2018, former Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 3232 (Friedman, Chapter 373, Statutes of 2018), which calls on the Energy Commission to, by 2021, develop an assessment of the feasibility of reducing the greenhouse gas emissions of California's buildings 40 percent below 1990 levels by 2030, working in consultation with the CPUC and other state agencies.

The 2019 IEPR scoping order includes a discussion of updated staff work on energy efficiency and building decarbonization. The Energy Commission plans to issue a report in 2019 that will contain updated SB 350 (De Leon, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) energy efficiency doubling targets, a refresh of the AB 758 (Skinner, Chapter 470, Statutes of 2009) Existing Building Energy Efficiency Action Plan, and preliminary work of the AB 3232 building decarbonization assessment. This workshop will inform that report.

The CPUC has issued an Order Instituting Rulemaking Regarding Building Decarbonization (R.19-01-011), and the Energy Commission is working jointly with the CPUC on the proceeding. A primary goal of the proceeding is to implement SB 1477. This workshop is the first opportunity to solicit stakeholder input in a workshop setting for this proceeding.

Public Comment

Oral Comments: Members of the public may offer questions or comments during the Q&A period after each of the workshop panel discussions. Public comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker and to one person per organization. If participating via WebEx, use the "raise hand feature" so the administrator can introduce you and unmute your microphone after comments from the floor.

Written comments. For the Energy Commission's IEPR proceeding, written comments must be submitted to its Docket Unit by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 22, 2019.
