Agenda

On June 4, 2019, staff will present, discuss, and solicit public comments on their assessment of California's liquid transportation fuel industry. This workshop will allow the public the opportunity to comment on current issues facing this industry that may shape staff's assessment of future transportation fuel supply, prices, and demand. Staff will present and discuss items included in the accompanying staff report for this workshop. Topics include:

- Refinery operations and crude oil use;
- Refinery production of liquid transportation fuels;
- Import and export volumes of liquid transportation fuels for Northern and Southern California;

- Industry regulatory changes;
- Transportation fuel price trends.

Liquid transportation fuels industry representatives from various throughout the fuel supply chain, as well as representatives from agencies regulating that supply chain will also be providing presentations covering the topics listed above.

Background

California Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the Energy Commission to prepare an IEPR every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. The Energy Commission uses these assessments to provide an analytic foundation for developing energy policies that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety.

The purpose of this workshop is to provide the Energy Commission and other stakeholders with the latest information on trends in liquid fuel production, storage, and distribution. Energy Commission staff will be displaying new analysis and data on liquid transportation fuels, using aggregated data collected by its Petroleum Industry Information Reporting Act regulations. New analysis and data was designed to improve public knowledge of the liquid transportation fuels supply chain. Stakeholder comments on this subject are encouraged.

Public Comment

Oral Comments: Staff will accept oral comments at the end of the workshop. Public comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker and to one person per organization. If participating via WebEx, use the “raise hand feature” so the administrator can introduce you and unmute your microphone after comments from the floor.
