Energy Commission staff will provide an overview of the preliminary statewide vehicle and transportation energy demand forecast, including the conventional and statewide zero-emission vehicle population forecast. Staff and technical support contractors will review:

- Transportation energy demand forecast
- Overview of methods, models, and assumptions
- Vehicle attributes
- Light-duty/zero emission vehicle forecast
- Medium-duty/heavy-duty forecast
- Fuel demand forecast
- Off-road electrification

Background

As required by Senate Bill 1389 (Bowen, Chapter 568, Statutes of 2002), the Energy Commission conducts "assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand and prices" (Public Resources Code Section 25302(a)). The Energy Commission uses these assessments and forecasts to provide an analytical foundation for developing energy policies that conserve resources, protect the environment, ensure energy reliability, enhance the state's economy, and protect public health and safety. Specific to transportation sector forecasting and assessment, Public Resources Code Section 25304 directs the Energy Commission to "conduct transportation forecasting and assessment activities..." as part of the Integrated Energy Policy Report.

On March 4, 2019, the Energy Commission held a workshop to present key inputs and assumptions for the 2019 California Energy Demand Forecast, including the transportation forecast. The presentations highlighted some of the inputs and assumptions of the preliminary forecast, as well as discussion of some of the market trends and changes since the last forecast. Topics that were discussed that were specific to the transportation energy demand forecast included: preliminary economic and demographic forecasts, preliminary fuel price forecast, market trends in light- and heavy-duty vehicle attributes, and the base year inputs and assumptions.

Public Comment

Oral Comments: Commissioners will accept oral comments at the end of the workshop. Public comments may be limited to three minutes or less per speaker and to one person per organization. If participating via WebEx, use the "raise hand feature" so the administrator can introduce you and unmute your microphone after comments from the floor.
