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## Notice of Availability Executive Director Determination on Glendale Water and Power's Integrated Resource Plan Filing Docket No. 18-IRP-01

Senate Bill 350 (SB 350) (De León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) amends section 9621 of the Public Utilities Code to require publicly owned utilities (POUs) with an annual electric demand exceeding 700 gigawatt hours to adopt integrated resource plans (IRPs) by January 1, 2019. POU IRPs must be submitted to the California Energy Commission (CEC) for review by April 30, 2019, and update them at least once every five years thereafter.

IRPs are electricity system planning documents intended to ensure that POUs lay out the resource needs, policy goals, physical and operational constraints, and general priorities or proposed resource choices of an electric utility, including customer-side preferred resources. These plans will provide a framework to evaluate how utilities have chosen to align with greenhouse gas emission reduction targets as well as energy and other policy goals outlined in SB 350.

Glendale Water and Power submitted its IRP filing to the CEC on July 29, 2019. Staff reviewed the Glendale Water and Power IRP for consistency with the requirements of Public Utilities Code section 9621. Based on staff's review, the Executive Director filed a determination on November 26, 2019 finding the Glendale Water and Power IRP filing consistent with the requirements of SB 350. The CEC plans to bring the determination to the March 2020 Business Meeting for adoption.

## **Public Comment**

Interested parties may comment on the Executive Director's determination within 45 days of being posted to the docket. Written comments should be submitted to the Dockets Unit by 5:00 p.m. on January 10, 2020.
