### Introduction

The Draft Program Guidelines for the Building Initiative for Low-Emissions Development (BUILD) Program (Draft BUILD Guidelines) are now available for review and comment. The Draft BUILD Guidelines establish the rules for program participation including, eligibility requirements, participation process, and incentive structure. ### **Background**

Senate Bill (SB) 1477 (Stern, Chapter 378, Statutes of 2018) authorized two building decarbonization programs to encourage the development and deployment of near-zero-emission building technologies: the BUILD Program and the Technology and Equipment for Clean Heating (TECH) Initiative.¹ BUILD is a residential building decarbonization program that provides technical assistance and incentives to support the adoption of advanced building design and near-zero-emission technologies in new low-income residential buildings. The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) approved the BUILD Implementation Plan April 15, 2021, which provided information about the anticipated requirements for program participation and served as a framing document for developing proposed program guidelines. At a workshop September 15, 2021,

California Energy Commission staff introduced a Preliminary Program Design for public comment that informed the development of the Draft BUILD Guidelines.
